Facilities

he Rutherford Building, our Sixth Form
Centre, has been designed to support and
stimulate students during this all-important
transitional phase of education. It houses a
state of-the-art, fully-staffed study centre,
café and modern lounge. There is also a
purpose-built Science Centre, with faculties clustered
throughout the School.

Extensive and impressive sports facilities include two astros, netball courts, a fully equipped fitness centre and indoor sports hall, a boathouse on the banks of the nearby River Great Ouse, a number of rugby, football and cricket pitches and a swimming pool on site.

We also have comprehensive performing arts and music facilities including a 300-seat auditorium, individual music practice rooms, a dance studio and two drama studios.

Curriculum

e offer a flexible curriculum with 28 subjects available and a team of dedicated learning mentors to help students meet their academic goals. Year on year we achieve consistently high results across the board, providing students with access to first choice universities and work placements. Most students select four subjects of study in Year 12 with the expectation that three of the subjects will be pursued to A Level in Year 13.



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The staff are truly supportive, particularly in the Sixth Form, where they will strive to help each and every student achieve their full potential, as well as encourage us to be more independent learners.



Co-Curricular Programme

tudents who participate in co-curricular activities develop higher academic results, better relationships at school, and are more likely to lead healthy, active lives when they leave. Participation in the many productions, choirs and orchestral performances is very high, extremely popular and greatly enjoyed by the large audiences they attract.


Bursaries and Scholarships

All applicants must pass the entry assessment and for subject-specific awards additional entry requirements apply. Bursaries are means tested and the early registration is recommended. A limited number of Sixth Form scholarships are available to students who excel in certain co-curricular subjects. Further details may be obtained from the School.

ostering personal development is a crucial component of life in the Sixth Form at BMS.
