Facilities

he School is located on the outskirts of
Bedford with commanding views of the
Bedfordshire countryside. Faculties are
clustered throughout the School together with
a pupose-built, state-of-the art Science Centre.

Extensive and impressive sports facilities include two astros, netball courts, a fully-equipped fitness centre and indoor sports hall, a boathouse on the banks of the nearby River Great Ouse, a number of rugby, football and cricket pitches and a swimming pool on site.

We also have comprehensive performing arts and music facilities including a 300-seat auditorium, individual music practice rooms, a dance studio and two drama studios.

The Rutherford Building, home to our Sixth Form, houses a fully-staffed study centre, café and modern lounge. The Junior School sits separately within the 40-acre site.

Curriculum

he Senior School curriculum offers an appealing combination of breadth and depth. Throughout this time our students study subjects for their own intrinsic value and in preparation for attaining the best possible outcomes.

All students benefit from a common curriculum in Years 7 and 8 which concentrates on the core subjects of Mathematics, English and Science as well as three humanities, three languages, and dedicated lessons in ICT, Design Technology, Music, Art and Drama.

Subject selection involves students and their parents as early as Year 8. Students continue to follow all the core subjects with a measure of choice being introduced. From Year 9 there are four options (with one Language being compulsory). Choices include Latin, Design Technology, Art, Drama and Music.

At GCSE students take a core of English Language, English Literature, Mathematics and three separate Sciences. They then choose four other subjects, one of which must be a Humanity (Geography, History, Religious Studies, Classical Civilisation) and one must be a Language (French, German, Spanish or Latin).

Other options at GCSE include: Art, Design Technology (of which there are two), Computer Science, Drama, Music and Physical Education.





Co-Curricular Programme

e offer an extensive programme of activities catering for all interests and strengths. Clubs range from yoga to fencing, Warhammer to climbing, and animation to chess. We also have a very active House System which encourages healthy competition across all year groups and provides leadership development opportunities.

The three most popular co-curricular activities are Performing Arts, Music and Sport. Every year we stage multiple shows and concerts and a large number of students take additional Speech and Drama, Music and Dance classes. We celebrate local, regional and national success in a variety of sports from rugby and football to swimming, cross-country and rowing as well as more unusual sports such as skiing.

In addition, in Years 7 and 8, we offer an outdoor and adventurous education programme to develop independence and new skills. From Year 9 the Combined Cadet Force (CCF) and The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme are open to all on a voluntary basis.

Every year we run a huge variety of trips, ranging from afternoon visits to local places of interest right through to a month trekking and carrying out community projects in the developing world.

A community service programme is a fundamental part of school life and includes on-going voluntary work opportunities and the organisation of fundraising events for good causes.

Student Support

t BMS we believe that all students should be extended beyond the curriculum and we offer a number of exciting opportunities including trips to museums, galleries and other places of educational interest, whether they be in Britain or overseas.

Academic Extension Days are arranged for whole year groups annually and throughout the year other events are organised which are carefully planned to inspire and stretch students.

The School has its own specialist Academic Support department which works with those students who require extra support and guidance. This allows students to work with specialists to supplement their learning in a dedicated space that provides a calm and private area in which to concentrate. Some children arrive at BMS with difficulties that have already been diagnosed; other children are identified through our rigorous and consistent screening processes and subsequently assessed by one of our own specialist teachers.

Students can also visit our Study Support Centre to get support and guidance with organisational skills, revision techniques, preparation for exams or any general questions or concerns.

breakfast club (food available for purchase) runs from 7.30am to 8.30am in the Rutherford Building. The School Day begins at 8.40am and finishes at 4.00pm. Common Rooms open at 8.00am and close at 4.30pm, after which time students may go to the Library until 5.00pm or to After School Care until 6.00pm. A range of co-curricular activities also take place every day after school.

Bursaries

e offer academic bursaries as well as specialist subject-specific awards in Art, Design Technology and IT (ADIT), Performance Arts, Music and Sport.
