

Year 5 Curriculum Information 2025 - 26

The school follows a two week timetable with lessons of 50 minutes in duration. Below you will find a summary of the main topics covered in Year 5, the name of the coordinator of the subject and an indication of the number of periods pupils have of each subject per fortnight.

English	Mrs Hale	10 periods
The curriculum is varied and covers a wide breadth of writing genres with the children experimenting with non-fictional and fictional pieces. The grammatical component again is broad with a variety of features and styles being utilised, consolidating work from Year 4 such as; varying sentence structure and direct and in-direct speech. Subordinate clauses, interjections and formal/informal language are just some areas that will be covered.		
Maths	Mrs Marshall	10 periods
Consolidation of numeracy skills from Year 4. Progressive inclusions within the main topic areas such as: Number, Fractions and Decimals, Data Handling, Shape and Space, Measures and Problem Solving.		
Science	Mrs Chambers	5 periods
The pupils experience lessons which aim to develop practical skills, scientific knowledge and understanding in order to provide a suitable foundation for further learning. The following topics are covered over the course of the year: Animals, including human life cycles, Earth and Space, Forces, Materials and their Properties and Plants.		
Humanities	Mrs Woolf	8 periods
In Year 5, students build on their foundational knowledge, refining key skills and exploring more complex themes across History, Geography, and Religious Education. Topics include map skills, the Ancient Greeks, the Tudors, extreme climates, and Hinduism. Students will deepen their understanding of the world around them, both past and present. Independent research is encouraged throughout the year, helping students take greater ownership of their learning.		
French	Mrs White	2 periods
A major proportion of the time will be allocated for children to experiment with language orally and consolidate the skills introduced from Year 4. Progressive material and skills will be taught and introduced and include: Festivals and Celebrations, Opinions, Hobbies, Family and Descriptions.		
Art	Miss Barlow	3 periods
A wide selection of skills are introduced and consolidated throughout the year. Areas of coverage include: Painting Colour and Feelings, Aboriginal Art, Drawing Texture and Portrait, Mod Roc Creatures, Printing and Perspective.		
DT	Mrs Fox	3 periods
A wide selection of skills are introduced and consolidated throughout the year. Areas of coverage include: Designing and making a Cushion, Cam Toys and Packaging.		
Music	Mr Bishop	2 periods
In Year 5, music lessons comprise of short, fun activities designed to practise and develop basic musical awareness. The main areas of focus are; Rounds, Train Music, African Rhythm, Journey into Space and Songwriting.		

ICT	Mrs Crawford-Smith	2 periods
Online Safety study continues in Year 5, as students develop their word processing skills using Microsoft Word. Coding and email skills are reinforced. During the Spring term, children begin to use MS Excel and will use Purple Mash to create a game. Physical computing will become a focus in the summer.		
PE	Mr Bucktin	2 periods
Throughout the year students will participate in the following areas of focus: Speed, Agility and Quickness (SAQ), Ball skills, Gymnastics and movement, Striking skills/Racket skills and Athletics.		
Games and Key Skills	Mr Bucktin	7 periods
Boys follow a programme of Rugby (Autumn Term), Football (Spring Term) and Cricket (Summer Term); whilst the girls follow a programme of Hockey (Autumn Term), Netball (Spring Term) and Cricket (Summer Term). Students are grouped by ability and there is a focus on both individual and team skills which are supported by Key Skills lessons, after school practices and the opportunity to play competitive matches.		
Swimming	Mrs Hawken	2 periods
Students are grouped by ability and focus on stroke development and proficiency in three main areas which include: breast stroke, backstroke and front crawl with an emphasis on timings and distance.		
Drama	Mrs Hale	1 period
Pupils have one standalone drama lesson but English teachers are encouraged to utilise English lessons to embed drama themes and skills during the English curriculum.
